Word from the Council President

I write this, my first message to the congregation as your Council President, post Synod Assembly. I am still humming tunes to songs from Swaziland, El Salvador, New Zealand, South Korea, Muscogee Indian and Puerto Rico that we sang at Assembly. The theme was, "We are Church, for the Sake of the World." As is evident everywhere, the world is changing and facing many challenges. Our Fox Valley neighborhood faces the same challenges. Prejudice, injustice, economic inequality, isolation, loneliness and shootings, bring the voice of fear into our hearts and minds. So do we hunker down in our church homes and tune out the world?? That is not the message we heard at the Assembly. The message is: we, the church, need to be present in the midst of the upheaval and turmoil in the world. God is out there waiting for us and He is speaking different languages and wears unfamiliar clothes. He may be a stranger to us.

What is God's message for us, at Trinity? It is the same. God calls us to be out in our neighborhood, following the example of Jesus, who washed the feet of His disciples, and listened to prostitutes and the poor. Although many of us may feel uncomfortable and fearful, we know that God promises to be with us and bind us together in His love. It is, in fact, an exciting time for Trinity, to take the lead here in the Fox Valley, as the church who embraces differences (language, dress, status) and welcomes "the stranger" in the community. God is asking all of us to be bold and embrace the calling of the Holy Spirit. Want to talk more about it? Call or email me with your thoughts.

Paul, in his letter to the Romans, reminds them (and us), "We who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak and not please ourselves. Each of us should please his neighbor for his good, to build him up."

We Are Church for the Sake of the World!

"We Are Church for the Sake of the World" was the theme our annual East Central Synod of Wisconsin Assembly - held this year in Appleton on May 17-18.

The Rev. Sunitha Mortha, director for Mission Formation in the Global Mission Unit of the ELCA, proclaimed a message of accompaniment. She shared that that living in the United States of America, many of us are steeped in an ideology of rugged individualism that is used to justify a system where children go to bed hungry, seniors worry about supporting themselves, people choose between medicine and housing, and individuals feel isolated from community.

In this reality, we start to believe that we can "do it alone." However, the Gospel truth is we cannot do it alone, and to do it together we cannot retreat to our separate corners, sticking to what we think we know best. Isolated, we fail... so, we reach across our denominational and cultural and ethnic boundaries in order to discover new possibilities for the future.

We are reminded that God calls us to engage in the world God loves in response to the grace we receive in Christ. Congregations have long been places where people share from their wealth for a common purpose. But at some point, we stopped talking about it that way. We started talking about "making the budget" and "balancing the books." This mentality causes problems when our gifts lose their connect to their purpose. So we reconnect with this purpose, reimagine service, and recommit to the idea that "we are church for the sake of the world." The "we" part brings us back to the mission of togetherness, pushing ministry organizations to pool resources beyond the church world.

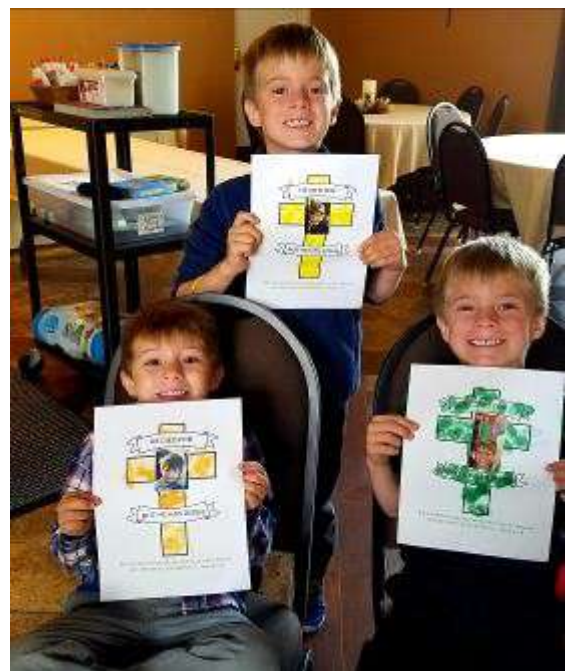
